First Reading Acts 11.1-18

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

- ¹ The apostles and the believers who were in Judea heard that the Gentiles had also accepted the word of God.
- ² So when Peter went up to Jerusalem, the circumcised believers criticized him,
- ³ saying, 'Why did you go to uncircumcised men and eat with them?'
- ⁴ Then Peter began to explain it to them, step by step, saying,
- ⁵ 'I was in the city of Joppa praying, and in a trance I saw a vision. There was something like a large sheet coming down from heaven, being lowered by its four corners; and it came close to me.
- ⁶ As I looked at it closely I saw four-footed animals, beasts of prey, reptiles, and birds of the air.
- ⁷ I also heard a voice saying to me, "Get up, Peter; kill and eat."

- ⁸ But I replied, “By no means, Lord;
for nothing profane or unclean has ever entered my mouth.”
- ⁹ But a second time the voice answered from heaven,
“What God has made clean, you must not call profane.”
- ¹⁰ This happened three times;
then everything was pulled up again to heaven.
- ¹¹ At that very moment three men, sent to me from Caesarea,
arrived at the house where we were.
- ¹² The Spirit told me to go with them and not to make a distinction
between them and us. These six brothers also accompanied me,
and we entered the man’s house.
- ¹³ He told us how he had seen the angel standing in his house
and saying, “Send to Joppa and bring Simon, who is called Peter;
¹⁴ he will give you a message by which you and your entire
household will be saved.”
- ¹⁵ And as I began to speak, the Holy Spirit fell upon them
just as it had upon us at the beginning.
- ¹⁶ And I remembered the word of the Lord, how he had said,
“John baptised with water,
but you will be baptised with the Holy Spirit.”
- ¹⁷ If then God gave them the same gift that he gave us
when we believed in the Lord Jesus Christ,
who was I that I could hinder God?
- ¹⁸ When they heard this, they were silenced.
And they praised God, saying, ‘Then God has given
even to the Gentiles the repentance that leads to life.’

A reading from the Book of Revelation

- ³ And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying,

- ⁴ he will wipe every tear from their eyes.

will be no more, for the first things have passed away.’

Acts 14.5-18

John 14.21-26

We pray for all refugees, particularly from Ukraine, many of whom will have been traumatised by what they have seen. We pray for healing of their minds and bodies, and interpreters to smooth language difficulties with kindness.

Tuesday 17

John 14.27-end

We pray for an easing of supply issues of necessary drugs, helping people to continue their course of treatment. We pray for all pharmacists as they struggle with the present situation.

Wednesday 18

Acts 15.1-6

John 15.1-8

We pray for all who have caught or may suffer with Covid. Give them patience with the duration of sickness, and the after-effects, as they attempt to regain normality.

Thursday 19

Acts 15.7-21

John 15.9-11

We pray for those in financial hardship, and that they may be guided to manageable remedies to ease their burden.

Friday 20

Acts 15.22-31

John 15.12-17

We pray for peace and security everywhere, and for a softening of the hearts of those in power, so that there is a radical change to all cultures rooted in violence.

Saturday 21

Acts 16.1-10

John 15.18-21

We pray for those who have been unjustly imprisoned, and for their families. We pray for quick and unconditional release of those detained for reasons of religion, belief or conscience.
